THE CLOTHES TREE opened October 1 in Atlantic Beach on the Salter Path Road. Mary Ashby who runs the shop is the wife of Lt. Colonel W. C. Ashby, a retired Marine officer. She tells us that she has always wanted to manage a dress shop, and now that her daughter is away at college and her son is seventeen, she has opened her store. The Clothes Tree carries both junior and misses sizes, long and short dresses, slacks, pants suits, and coordinates. Prices are moderate, and as for style-- your editor succumbed and bought a blouse when she went in to talk with Mrs. Ashby.

Across from the Holiday Inn is ULETIDE CORNER owned and operated by Janet and Gary Plough.
