# **PKS Spring White Goods** and Bulk Waste Pickup

The spring collection of bulk waste and white goods is scheduled for Tuesday, May 15. This is a one-day pickup, and all items *must* be out on Monday night. Please note that items put out after the initial collection will not be picked up.

Bulk waste includes household furniture, mattresses, bedding, outdoor grills (propane tanks are excluded), outdoor furniture, bags of clothing and small quantities of construction and demolition material normally associated with minor homeowner repairs. Items other than furniture must be bagged or tied in bundles, with long items not to exceed four feet in length. Doors can be discarded in their full length. Typical white goods are appliances such as refrigerators, freezers, washing machines, clothes dryers, dishwashers and hot water heaters. *Absolutely no used tires, batteries, light bulbs, oil, grease, paint, or any other materials that are considered toxic will be collected since these materials are considered to be hazardous.* The Coastal Environmental Partnership (which includes Carteret, Craven and Pamiico counties) holds a hazardous waste day annually at the Carteret County Health Department, 3820 Bridges Street in Morehead City, to collect these items. The 2018 date is Saturday, September 22, from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m.
