

Scam of the Month: Contractor Scams

Our officers are still investigating felony cases involving residents who have been scammed by a contractor as a result of Hurricane Florence. In July, two of our officers went to Las Vegas to extradite a fugitive who had over 20 outstanding felony warrants for scamming hurricane victims. If you have a bad feeling about a contractor, trust your gut. Some of our victims will take years to financially recover from the damage that was done by con men posing as contractors. Don't trust contractors who go door-to-door, ask you to refer them to other customers, ask for payment up front, and do everything with a handshake instead of giving you a quote in writing. Research their company online and ask for a list of references from previous customers. You should not do business with a contractor who can't provide a reference list or written quote/ invoice.
