PKS Fifth Annual Fishing Tournament

The annual Pine Knoll Shores Family Fishing Tournament, which is sponsored by the Parks and Recreation Committee (PARC), will be held on October 17. Registration closed on October 1, but all are welcome to come out to McNeill Park from 4 to 5 p.m. on tournament day to see the weigh-in. Please remember to bring a mask and be aware of the 50-person limit for outdoor activities.

Participants will be allowed to fish from the surf, a pier, a kayak or a boat, and those 16 and over will be required to have a current North Carolina saltwater fishing license. To be considered for competition, fish must be in the legal range for each category. Weigh-ins and trophies will be as follows:

- Adult catch (ages18 and over)—red drum, speckled trout, gray trout, bluefish, sea mullet and sheepshead. Winners will be determined by weight in each category.
- Young adult (ages 13-17)—red drum, speckled trout, gray trout, bluefish, sea mullet and sheepshead. Winners will be determined by weight in each category.
- Kids (ages 12 and under)—There is a separate tournament for children ages 12 and under. An adult must accompany children during this event and at weigh-in. Winners will be determined by weight of any fish caught.
