Instruction in CPR (Cardiac Pulmonary Resuscitation) will be offered to residents of Pine Knoll Shores in three sessions April 10, 17 and 21, it was announced by Ken Doremus, director of the Rescue Squad. Each session will be for four hours and will be limited to 20 persons per session. It is requested that those who wish to take advantage of this important activity sign up and pick up their booklet at least two days before each session.
