defense channel.

In response Mr. Crane explained that an FM channel has been available since November, 1980, with music from an eastern North Carolina station, for which there is an annual charge of \$18. He also said that in the event of calls concerning interrupted service every effort always has been made to correct the matter as promptly as possible. He stated that expanding the number of channels has been delayed pending the merger with Newhouse, and stated that this probably will include an all-sports channel and an all-news channel. Finally, he said, with the addition of a planned satelite receiver there will be improved FM reception.

The group also said that with new and improved antennas reception from Channel 11 (WUNK) and CHANNEL 7 (Washington) will be enhanced.

Since the meeting, Mayor Cleveland has recieved a letter from Mr. Crane advising him that arrangements have been completed with station WFMT, at Chicago, to include their transmissions. This station, he said, was recently designated as the "Best FM Station in the Country" for its unique programming and technical excellence. Their programming includes live broadcasts and pre-recorded tapes from eight orchestras; including the Chicago Symphony, Boston Pops and the Lyric Opera of Chicago. As soon as the equipment is in place, he said, subscribers will be notified and that there will be no increase in the FM rate.
