the concussion; during that time she was fed only mealworms and shelled sunflower - we didn't want her to further injure the beak by cracking seeds!

We decided that a beak repair was necessary; if the cardinal broke off her beak in the wild, she would be unable to eat and would starve to death. A new technique was used-the medical equivalent of Crazy Glue!!

After two days for the glue to set, we gave her an acorn and held our breaths. She cracked it neatly in half and the beak held firm! A test flight in our aviary showed good balance and elevation, so she was returned to Oakleaf Drive, and is probably eating at one of your feeders....another miracle of modern science.
