OWLS' PATIENT UPDATE: NORTHERN GANNETS

In November, we told you about the "unknown disease" that's killing hundreds of our waterbirds, and about how we had finally gotten U.S. Fish and Wildlife and the N. C. Wildlife Resources Commission involved. About 50 bodies were shipped to wildlife disease labs in Wisconsin and Georgia.

We're beginning to get some reports back with test results. They have determined that almost all of the gannets had salmonella. Rather than solving the problem, this fact creates another mystery: how does a bird who lives 50 miles out in the ocean contract salmonella?? The organism is only found near land, and besides, it shouldn't be enough to cause massive internal hemorrhaging.

There are many questions left to be answered, and many tests still being done. We'll keep you posted.
