MAY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MEETING

WASTE INDUSTRIES

Dallas Goodwin of Waste Industries presented residential recycling information as it pertains to cost for the Town. He also included in his remarks the cost of commercial recycling. The Town was praised for its enthusiastic participation and support of the recycling mandate.

COASTAL REGIONAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY

Lori Dietz, engineer with CRSWMA, spoke about the operating life of the Authority which is predicted to be about four and one half years, and the closing of the county land fill. Reporting requirements will have to be met by each municipality and county. The decision concerning recycling was left with the counties and each municipality and county is accountable to the state for their recycling.
