DRAINS TO BE MONITORED

As the result of a request by Pine Knoll Association, the Department of Transportation will put check valves on storm drains which infiltrate into the canal from Hwy. 58. A program to monitor the flow will perhaps help in the determination to improve the quality of water in the canal and subsequently that of Bogue Sound.
