Also, keep your vehicle(s) locked at all times. Don't leave valuable items in your vehicle. If you have no choice but to leave items in your vehicle, lock them in the trunk or place them out of sight. Never leave valuable items in plain view. This will only entice the thief.

Concerned citizens have asked us to remind residents that it is important for everyone's safety that when on town streets, pedestrians should walk on the side of the road facing the traffic, but bicyclists should ride on the side with traffic.
