Looking for something you can AQUARIUMS really sink your teeth into? Well, the aquarium has just the thing.

Two new summer program series will feature some of our area's most mysterious and interesting creatures. Each Tuesday will be Shark Day and each Thursday will be Reptile Day. Day-long activities will highlight these animals and it's all free.

On Tuesdays, little-know facts about sharks, skates and rays will be explored in videos, films, programs and crafts. Learning stations and discovery carts will feature hands-on natural relics, such as shark jaws and skin, egg cases, stingray barbs, life-like mounts and other relics. On Thursdays, the focus will switch to reptiles, such as fresh and saltwater turtles, alligators and snakes. Natural relics will include turtle shells,
