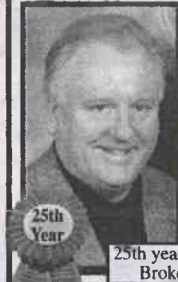
Garden Club members also pick up trash every other week in selected areas.

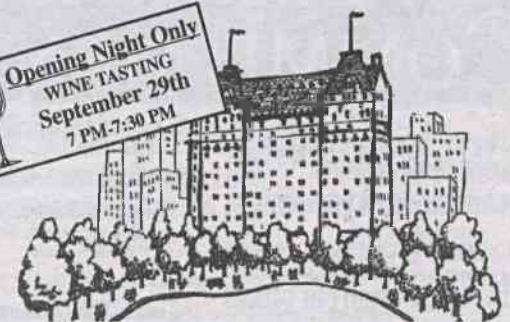
