Organized in 1914, USPS is a non-profit, educational organization dedicated to making boating safer and more enjoyable by teaching classes in seamanship, navigation and related subjects. Our members are boating families who contribute to their communities by promoting safe boating through education. We enjoy participating

with our fellow members on the water and in the classroom. USPS has some 60,000 members in 450 squadrons across the country and some in the United States territories. The Fort Macon Sail and Power Squadron meets monthly and services our local area. USPS is America's largest non -profit boating organization and has been honored by three United States presidents for its civic contributions.

## What are the activities of USPS

Each squadron's activities involve the three primary objectives of USPS: community service, continuing education, and enjoying the friendship and camaraderie of our fellow members.

Local squadrons offer boating safety courses on a regular basis to boaters in our communities. These courses are open to the public and there is no age limit for participants.
