### Police Report

During August, there were 129 calls for service, including 4 accidents, 8 assist other agencies, 5 assist fire/EMS, 1 domestic, 7 motorist assists, 9 ordinance violations, 21 welfare checks, 12 alarms and 4 open

Twenty-seven citations involving 32 charges were issued -- 4 driving while impaired, 9 speeding, 1 driving while suspended, 9 alcohol violations and 9 other. Four warning tickets were issued.

There were 129 residence checks and 262 business checks.

Because of an incident on N.C. 58, a suspect was transported to the Morehead Police Department where he was tested by a trained drug recognition officer who concluded the suspect was impaired.

#### Emergency Services

During August, there were 12 EMS calls, eight required transport and six required paramedic assistance. Average response time was 3:25 minutes.

There were 21 fire calls, 12 activated alarms, two structure fires, five service calls, one brush fire and one vehicle fire. One of the structure fires was at Maritime West with \$40,000 damage. Average response time was 3:49 minutes.

Members logged 281 hours of training during the month.

Six commercial properties were inspected and eight violations were cited and corrected.

During Tropical Storm Ernesto, PKS experienced gusts up to 62 mph with sustained winds up to 55 mph.

The Community Radio (1610 AM) worked very well and it was a tremendous benefit, especially when a waterspout was seen off the beach.

Work is underway to get signage for the Community Radio station to be posted on Salter Path Road.

Commissioner Ashland commented that the town now has good communication capability with the town newspaper, website and the community radio.




