Three area sites were among the top 15 most-visited attractions in North Carolina according to the May issue of NC Magazine. Fort Macon State Park was fifth on the list of the 25 most visited historic attractions and museums in the state. Number seven on the list was the North Caroline

Aguarium in Pine Knoll Shores. The North Carolina Maritime Museum in Beaufort was number 15. Topping the list with more than 1.1 million visitors was Biltmore in Asheville which tallied 325,211 more visitors than Charlotte's Discovery Place, which took second place honors.
