Here are some of things going on at town hall and around the town:

• Dredging of the Canal- About the time you are reading this we will have begun moving about 2,000 cubic yards of spoils from the shallow areas of the canal. While we won't get every spot, we hope to get the worst. We also will address some of the bad spots in the town's "channel," the area that runs parallel to the line on the sound. We'll do our best to prevent sand/mud on the road between the spoils pick-up points (Brock Basin, Davis Landing, Hall Haven, Ramsey Park) and the drop-off point (the Public Services Bldg.), but expect to have something on the road. - Water Leaks- We have had a few leaks in town that have caused some outages. Sonny Cunningham has been on top of these and fixed them in short order. If you see free standing water collecting and not draining near a road, and if we didn't just have some rain, call Sonny at 723-0055.

The best response to this is an immediate 911 call---this is the fastest way to get an officer on scene. If you see someone on beachfront area
