## **Beach Wheelchairs Available**

The Carteret County Mayors' Committee for Persons with Disabilities kicked off their awareness effort this past month with a ribbon cutting in Emerald Isle. Shown cutting the ribbon are Carol Lohr, Emerald Isle Mayor Art Schools, Elaine Tempel from Pine Knoll Shores, Kim Hebert and Pat Wesson. The committee was formed 20 years ago and their aim has been to make Carteret County accessible to all persons who have a physical or mental challenges.

A recent goal has been to make the beaches more accessible to the elderly and the disabled and a number of beach wheel-chairs have been donated to help with that cause. These wheelchairs cost \$2,500 a piece and their large fat tires and sturdy construction allow persons with disabilities to enjoy the beach. They are available for loan at the local Fire Departments in Atlantic Beach (726-3775), Pine Knoll Shores (247-2268), Indian Beach (247-7994) and Emerald Isle (354-2445) – as well as at Fort Macon Park (726-3775). You should call ahead to reserve a chair as they are popular and it's not unusual to find them checked out by 10 a.m. most mornings.
