Seventh Annual Kayak for the Warriors

Are your kayaks and paddleboards ready for the seventh annual Kayak for the Warriors event? On Thursday, June 5, there is a homes tour of 12 unique houses on the beach, canals and sound. The tour begins at 3 p.m. and will end in time for everyone to get to the site of the warriors' reception and auction. Tickets are \$30, adults only, and include admission to the reception and auction at the North Carolina Aquarium, beginning at 7 p.m. and ending promptly at 9 p.m. Light food and wine will be available, and you will have an opportunity to bid on some great items. On Saturday, June 7, the kayak and paddleboard race will begin at 10 a.m. at Garner Park on Oakleaf Drive and complete a 3.2-mile course around the canals. Paddleboarders will start five minutes before kayakers. The \$45 registration fee includes a t-shirt and lunch. We will once again feature the warrior race in which a participant could win the coveted prize by raising the most money for Hope for the Warriors®. For every dollar raised by each racer, one second will be deducted from his/ her actual race time. The racer with the shortest calculated time is the winner. At 8:30 a.m., fun 5K and 10K bike
