(Dee) James Murphy has just received a medical discharge from the Navy and is now at home with his wife in Winston-Salem, N. C.

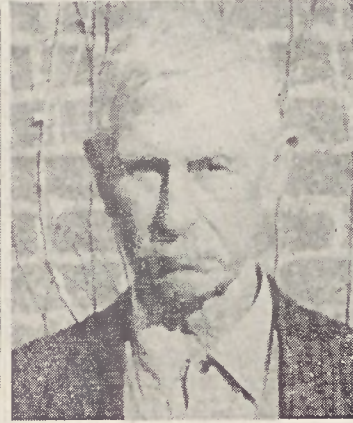

Mrs. Sunshine Caudle has received word from her husband that he has landed safely in England.

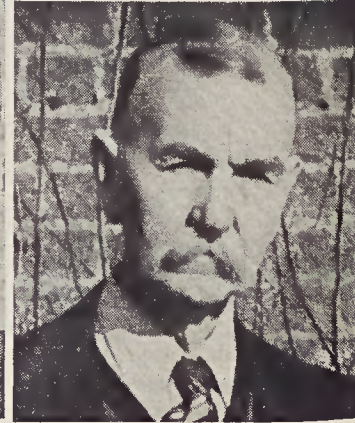
