## Nearly All Employees Participate In Revised Group Insurance Plan

The revised group insurance plan became effective March 25 with 99% of all employees covered. Those who have not signed cards as yet will have the privilege of taking the insurance without a medical examination provided they sign up before April 25. They, of course, will be without insurance until the date they sign the card.

The 99% coverage figure includes those persons who went out sick prior to March 25 and who have not returned to work as yet. This group is receiving benefits under the old plan and it is
