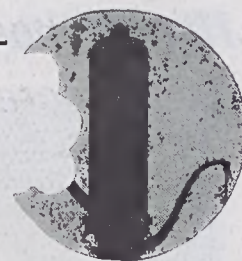

Stettinius To Address Management Conference On Public Relations

Edward R. Stettinius, Jr., former U. S. Secretary of State, and now rector of the University of Virginia, will speak in the Leaksville High School auditorium Saturday evening October 18 as one of the highlights of the Fieldcrest Mills management conference on "Looking Ahead in Our Public Relations."

Mr. Stettinius, one of the outstanding figures in national and international affairs, will speak on "What Makes for Good Public Relations?" His address will be broadcast over Station WLOE (1490 kilocycles) at Leaksville.
