## Wage Increase Is Effective Today; New Minimum 87¢

Nine Per Cent Raise Applies At All Fieldcrest Mills In Tri-Cities And Fieldale

Fieldcrest Mills and the Textile Workers Union of America jointly announced agreement on a 9% increase in wages effective Monday, November 10, at the conclusion of a conference Thursday, November 6, between company officials and the union negotiating committee. The increase applies to all hourly paid and piece-rate workers with a few exceptions. The minimum rate will be 87c per hour according to the announcement.

The increase will be effective in the following mills: Karastan and Bedspread Mills, Leaksville; Blanket and Sheeting Mills, Draper; Finishing Mill, Bleachery and Central Warehouse, Rayon, Woolen, and Embroidered Bedspread Mills, Spray.
