Local Citizens Will Give Blood For Armed Forces September 21

Quota Is 200 Pints When Bloodmobile Makes Third Visit To Armory

The Red Cross Bloodmobile is again coming to the Tri-Cities. It will be at the Leaksville armory from 11 a. m. until 5 p. m. Friday, September 21.

When the Bloodmobile came here in February 201 pints of blood were given for the Armed Forces. A smaller number of donors participated on the Bloodmobile's second visit in May. The quota for the third visit next Friday is 200 pints.

D. L. Craddock, Red Cross blood program chairman, said it would be necessary to schedule all donors so that as many as possible can be accommodated. Persons who wish to give blood and have not yet received an appointment may call the Red Cross office (Tel. 686) or Radio Station WLOE (Tel. 701).

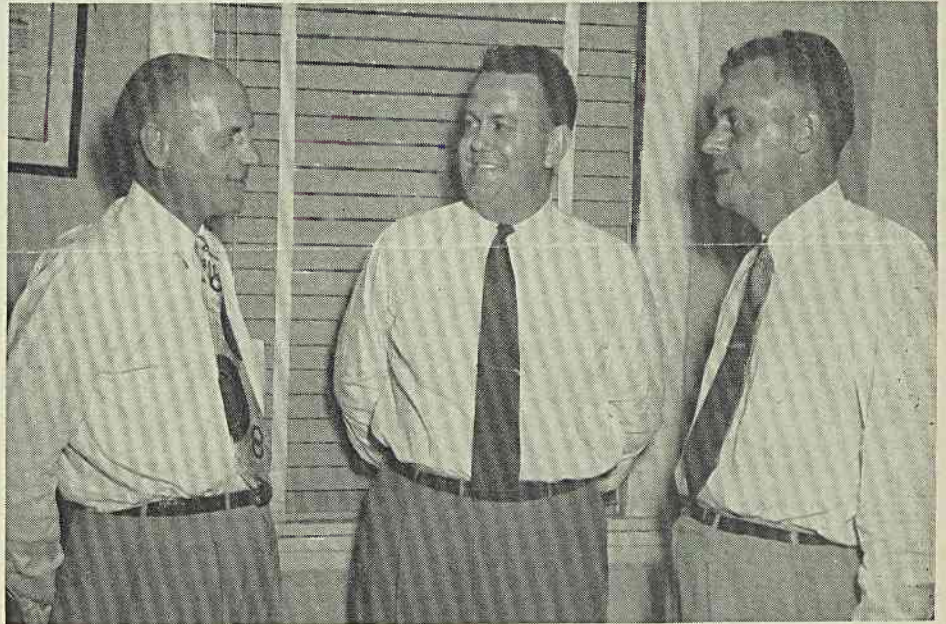
Council Meetings Set For This Week
