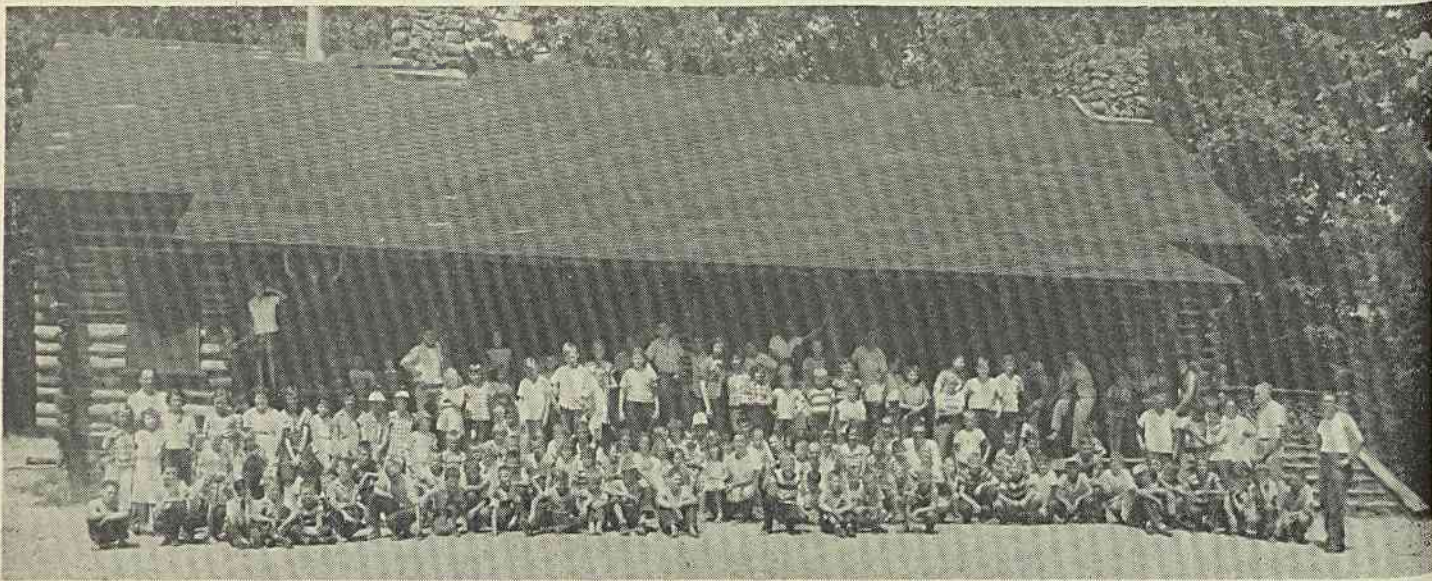


Leaksville-Spray Youngsters Enjoy Exchange Club's "Sunshine Special"
