

## Formal Opening Set For New Rayon Mill

Plant Will Go Into Operation Monday, December 10; Employees To Visit On Sunday

The New Rayon Mill, located at the former Woolen Mill site, will be formally opened Sunday afternoon, December 9. The Fieldcrest Radio Program will be broadcast from the new mill and will carry a portion of the dedication ceremonies.

Rayon Mill employees and their families are being mailed invitations to the formal opening. They are being requested to arrive at the mill by 2:45 p. m. in order that the crowd may be seated before the broadcast begins at 3 p. m. Following the program, employees and their families wil be conducted on tours of the new plant.

Later in the same week it is planned to have an "open house" for the general public to give employees of our other mills and community people an opportunity to see the new mill.


## Store Schedule
