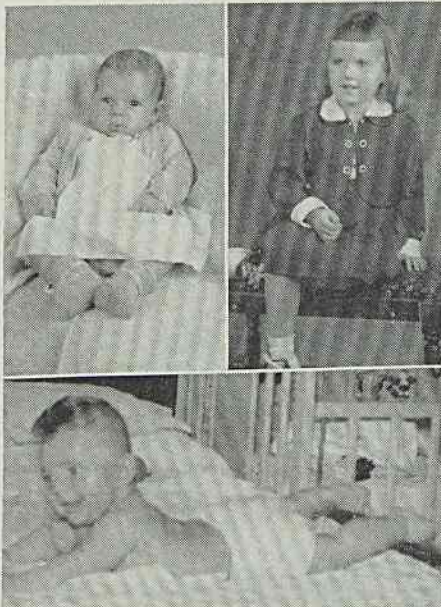
## Sunshine Boys Quartet To Appear Here May 8
