Do not iron terry cloth towels. Ironing decreases their absorbency.

If you must prepare breakfast hurriedly each morning, save time by putting margarined bread, covered, in the refrigerator or other cold place overnight. It's ready to pop into the stove immediately the next morning.

Use leftover mashed potatoes in potato cakes. Shape into cakes; roll in flour. Brown on both sides in one to two tablespoons of melted margarine. If desired, add a little grated onion or cheese, or

chopped cooked meat.

Wash your towels in piping hot water unless they are of a delicate color. Textile scientists say that water at 140 degrees F. takes more soil out of cotton materials and removes it faster than does lukewarm water.

Do not let towels become too soiled. Hard rubbing to remove grime is hard on the towels.
