

New Swimming Pool Opened At Fieldale

Fieldale's new \$40,000 swimming pool was officially opened with ribbon-cutting ceremonies Tuesday evening June 26. More than 1,100 persons attended program formally opening the beautiful new pool.

Highlight of the dedication ceremony was the appearance of 18 girls in a water ballet and swimming demonstration directed by Bob Jamieson, head coach at Greensboro high school.

Charlie Adams, vice-president of radio Station WHEE in Martinsville, was master of ceremonies. The invocation was given by the Rev. Raleigh H. Mann, pastor of Fieldale Methodist church. D. A. Purcell, manager of the Towel Mill, gave the address of welcome and cut the ribbon formally opening the pool to swimmers. The main speaker was the Rev. W. T. Mills, pastor of Fieldale Baptist church.

The pool was built through the cooperative efforts of the Fieldale Community Center, Rotary and Fieldale Service clubs and other Fieldale groups.

R. A. Harris Promoted To Vice-President

Election of Robert A. Harris as vicepresident of Fieldcrest Mills, Inc., has been announced by President Harold W. Whitcomb.
