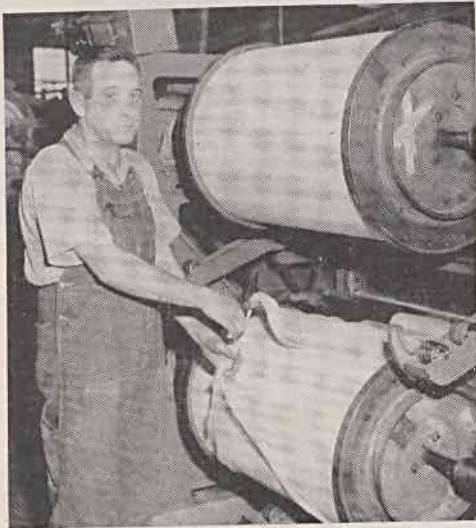


# Members of the Fieldcrest Team
