

# 'Y' Conducts Successful Stay-At-Home Camps

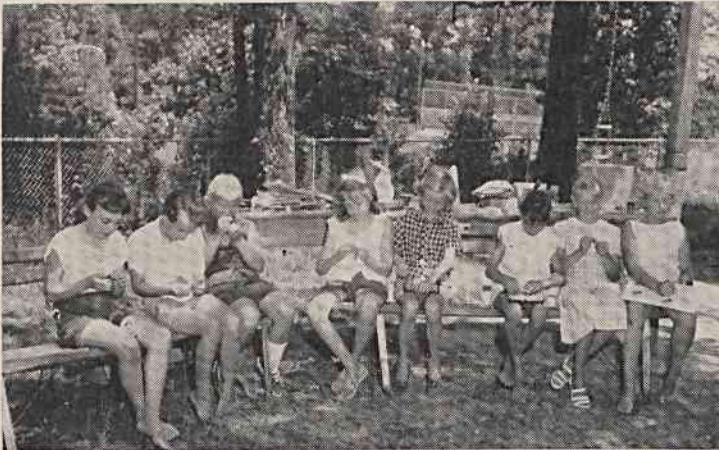

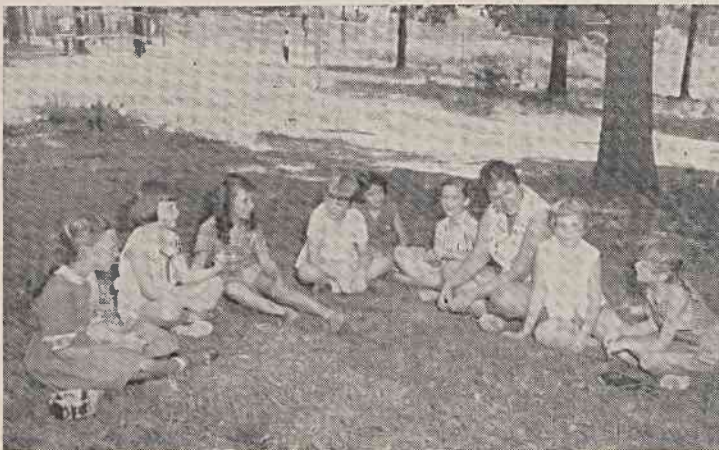
