CARBON MONOXIDE GAS

Auto Exhaust Fumes Contain Deadly Poison

With cooler weather, comes one of the most vicious threats to human lifecarbon monoxide gas poisoning. Because it is odorless, colorless, and tasteless, this gas attacks its vicitims without warning, frequently resulting in death.

The most common source of carbon monoxide gas is exhaust from an automobile. In cooler weather the tendency is to drive with car windows tightly closed. Exhaust fumes may seep into the car and be inhaled. Because of its characteristics, one may be unaware of the gas until symptoms develop.

The symptoms may be headache, dizziness, disturbed memory, muscular weakness, progressing to coma and death. These symptoms are due to the gas mixing with the hemoglobin and replacing the oxygen, with resultant suffocation.

Whenever coal, wood, oil or any other fuel is burned, carbon monoxide is formed.

Accidents from carbon monoxide are preventable. Don't drive with car windows tightly shut. If running the car motor in the garage, make certain there is fresh air. In your home, if using gas heating or appliances, make certain there is a source of air present.

Call a physician, at once, in any case of carbon monoxide gas poisoning. Early treatment may save the individual's life.
