Bedsread Mill Gets President's Plaque

Company Units Are Honored For Their Outstanding Support Of Tri-City Community Fund

The President's Plaque, given to the mill in which the highest percentage of the employees pledged a day's pay or more to the Tri-City Community Fund, has been awarded to the Bedsread Mill for the second consecutive year.

A similar plaque was presented to the Industrial Relations Department, a second-year winner among the major staff departments.

President Harold W. Whitcomb, in an informal ceremony in his office Tuesday, January 3, presented the plaques to Frank E. Barron, assistant manager of the Bedsread Mill, who accepted it on behalf of the employees, and to Clinton Frank, director of industrial relations, who accepted the award on behalf of the employees of his department.

The handsome plaques will be displayed prominently at the Bedsread Mill.

Bloodmobile

The Bloodmobile will be stationed at the Leaksville armory from 11 a. m. to 4:30 p. m. Monday, January 16, as the Tri-Cities begin participation in the Piedmont Carolinas Blood Program sponsored by the American Red Cross.

The community-wide program was undertaken at the request of the medical staff of the Morehead Memorial Hospital in order that there might be a ready supply of life-saving blood and its derivatives to enable the hospital to better serve its patients.

Under the plan, the hospital will be supplied blood for its total needs and all patients will be supplied blood through the program.

The Bloodmobile will come here every two months, rotating its visits from Leaksville, to Spray, to Draper. The year's quota is 850 pints.

Solicitors are working throughout the community to recruit donors for the January 16 visit. Persons who wish to donate blood are requested to call the Red Cross Chapter, telephone MAin 3-3832 if they are not contacted by a solicitor.

Exemption Changes Should Be Reported

Changes in the number of exemptions for Federal and state income tax purposes should be reported promptly. All such changes received by the Payroll Department in January will be put into effect. Revised federal exemption certificates received after January 31 will not be put into effect until July 1.

However, employees should continue to notify the Payroll Department within 10 days of any change in their dependents for federal or state income taxes such as death, divorce, separation, births, dependents earning over \$600, etc.

Any overpayment or underpayment of tax by an employee will always be adjusted by the income tax division when the employee files his income tax return for the year.

Forms for completing a revised exemption certificate for either state or federal withholding tax may be obtained from the foreman, department head, or the industrial relations supervisor in your mill area.

It's That Time Again—List Your County Taxes

Listing taxes for the year 1961 for Rockingham County began January 2 and will end February 1.

Those who live in Leaksville Township can list their county taxes at the Leaksville armory during the entire month of January.

The listers will be at the Spray Town Hall January 12 and 13 from 9 a. m. until 4:45 p. m. for the convenience of taxpayers in that area.

The listers will be at the Draper Town Hall January 16, 17, 18, 19 and 20 from 9 a. m. until 4:45 p. m.

The hours for listing at the Leaksville armory will be from 9 a. m. until 5 p. m., Monday through Friday and from 9 a. m. until 12 o'clock noon on Saturday.
