
Clarence Martin, of the Engineering Department, has been honored for his Boy Scout work at the First Methodist Church in Draper.

The brick Scout Building was erected on the church lot and serves as headquarters for all Boy Scout and Girl Scout activities at the church.


Two Fieldcrest Ads To Appear This Week

Blanket Weavers Set Good Quality Records

A large number of Blanket Mill weavers continue to make the quality honor list, signifying six months of work without a major quality defect. Eleven plain or dobby weavers and six jacquard weavers made the honor list for the six months ending March 31.

Included were five weavers who have worked for two full years or more without a major quality defect in their cloth. These were Lessie Chilton, Otra Chilton, Mattie Hall, Dillard Harris and Sallie Isley.

New names added to the list for March were those of Drewry Chilton, Henry Hutson, and Gladys Powell in the plain or dobby group and Jesse Kennon and Mack Overby in the jacquard group.

The listing of the quality weavers is part of a program at the Blanket Mill designed to emphasize the importance of quality weaving and to give recognition for outstanding records.

In order to make the quality honor list, a weaver must work for six months without a major quality defect.

When a weaver on the list has a major quality defect, his name is dropped. Other weavers are added as they attain six months of quality work.
