Your Power Mower: How To Use It Safely

Imagine what would happen if a per- son were struck by a steel blade travel- ing 150 miles an hour!

Most rotary power lawn mower blades travel that fast are also capable of throwing sticks, stones, or other objects at comparable speeds.

Power lawn mowers are now in a majority among homeowners and the number of mishaps has increased in proportion to the upsurge in popularity of the power mower during the past 15 years.

Don't be the victim of a power lawn mower. Regard your mower as a piece of power equipment and teach others to respect it similarly.

Here are some suggestions from the Fieldcrest Safety Department for the safe use of power lawn mowers:

1. Before starting to mow, clear the lawn of all debris that could catch onto or be thrown by the blade.
2. Be sure you know how to stop the mower and motor at a moment's notice.
3. Try to avoid pulling the mower backwards toward you, particularly on a slope.
4. Do not operate power mowers in wet grass, which clogs the mower and increases the danger of your slipping and falling.
5. Never allow children to operate a power mower and make sure that chil- dren and pets are kept away from the mowing area.
6. Never leave the mower running un- attended.
7. Keep feet safely away from the blade when starting the engine.
