# 500,000 To Be Given In Vacation Pay

### ver \$1-Million To Be Paid This Week In Vacation ay, Regular Pay And Monthly Salary Paychecks

Vacation pay for Fieldcrest employwill amount to over a half mildollars. The vacation checks will distributed to eligible employees with regular paychecks on Thursday Friday of this week.

the vacation pay, combined with the vacation pay, combined with the payroll and the month-bayroll of salaried employees to be Friday, gives a figure well in exof a million dollars that the com-

pany will pay this week to employees in North Carolina and Virginia.

A preliminary report by the Payroll Department showed that 4,759 vacation checks had been written totaling \$504,-255. Of this amount \$388,247 will be paid to 3,706 employees in the North Carolina mills and \$116,008 will go to 1,053 employees of the Towel Mill at Fieldale, Virginia.

As usual, a high percentage of the

employees now working will draw vacation pay. In addition, those out sick and those laid off within the past 12 months will, in most cases, be eligible for some vacation pay.

Under the Fieldcrest vacation pay plan, employees with five or more continuous years of service receive four per cent of their past year's earnings. This amount represents the equivalent of about two weeks of extra pay.

Employees with one or more years of service but less than five years receive two per cent of their past year's earnings or about one week of extra pay.

A large majority will receive vacation pay at the four per cent figure. The records show that the number receiving the larger amount has been going up each year.

Fieldcrest was one of the first textile companies to provide paid vacations for employees. The plan was started in 1940 and vacation pay has been issued each summer since that time.

Employees who last worked in the Automatic Blanket Mill at Spray and who are eligible for vacation pay may pick up their vacation pay checks at the Employment Office in the General Offices building starting at 8 a. m. Wednesday, June 28.
