E. S. Klein Elected President Of Maguire Firm

John P. Maguire Elected To New Post Of Chairman

At a meeting of the firm's board of directors in New York in December, E. Stanley Klein was elected president of J. P. Maguire & Co., Inc., effective January 1.

He succeeds John P. Maguire who was elected to the new post of chairman of the board.

Mr. Klein had been a vice president of J. P. Maguire & Co., Inc., since the firm was organized in 1936. He earlier was a vice president of Amos Parrish & Co., Inc., consultants to retail store managements.

The Maguire company, of 370 Fourth Avenue in New York City, is a general factor to the textile industry. The com-

pany has factored all accounts of Fieldcrest Mills, Inc., since 1953.

Both Mr. Klein and Mr. Maguire are directors and stockholders of Fieldcrest Mills, Inc. Many older employees remember them from the sale of the company houses to employees in 1941. The sale was handled by a group of which Mr. Maguire and Mr. Klein were principals.

Mr. Klein and the late Frederick H. Wandelt, a vice president of J. P. Maguire & Co., Inc., spent approximately six months in the Tri-Cities and Fieldale, Va., and personally handled the sale of the houses to employees. During this period, Mr. Klein made many friends among Fieldcrest employees and local business people.

New Vice President Is Specialist In Finance

Richmond R. Roberts, who was recently elected a vice president of Fieldcrest Mills, Inc., has been directly engaged in accounting and finance for over 25 years, 20 years with the General Electric Company in various parts of the country and for the past five years as treasurer of Fieldcrest Mills, Inc.

A native of Wise, Va., he graduated from Emory and Henry College, Emory, Va., with an A. B. degree in English and Political Science and with an excellent record in mathematics. He was a high school teacher for one year at Appalachia, Va.

While teaching school, he began his study of accounting through La Salle Extension University. He then worked for 18 months as a punch press operator, machinist's helper, and office clerk for the Osborne Register Company, Cincinnati, Ohio.

Starting with General Electric in 1936 in accounting clerical jobs, he was promoted to assistant supervisor in Bridgeport, Conn., and subsequently was engaged in studies of tax regulations and the preparation of company-wide income tax returns in Schenectady, N. Y.

He was for some time financial assistant to the manager of General Electric's
