The Flu And You

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Influenza produces an illness with symptoms of a severe "virus attack" with which we are all familiar.

The simple protective vaccination you can take can play an important part in guarding you against discomfort and unpleasantness. However, once the disease is contracted, the vaccine is ineffective.

There is no distinctive symptom of influenza. The disease starts quickly after an incubation period of 24-72 hours.

There may be weakness, lassitude, chills, muscular pain, headaches, fever 101-103 degrees, nausea, vomiting, sore throat, and cough. Not every patient will show all of these symptoms, but any combination of them.

Doctor Should Be Consulted

There is no specific treatment. Bed rest, aspirin and plenty of fluids are effective measures, but your doctor should be consulted, to forestall any complications.

The disease ordinarily will run its course in 2-5 days, after which there may be a period of feeling weak. Early treatment may in many cases lessen the length of illness.

Influenza is highly contagious, presumably spread through direct personal contact or droplet infection through coughing or sneezing. Heavily populated industrial areas are therefore more vulnerable to an epidemic than thinly-settled regions.
