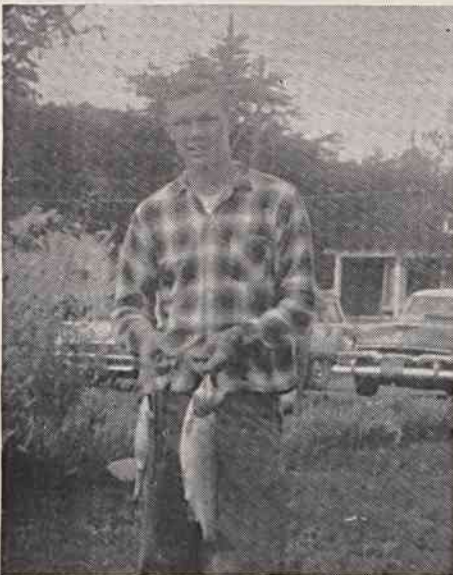
Her father is a weaver at the Blanket Mill and her mother, Doris Kennon, is employed in the Quilling Department at the Sheeting Mill.

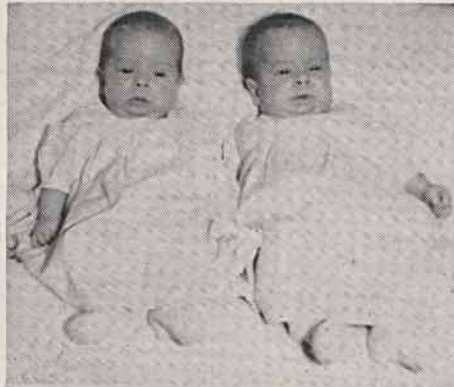
Makes Good Catch
