However, the amount of blood donated was short of the 142 pints needed to maintain the quota for the Tri-City area, which is 850 pints a year.

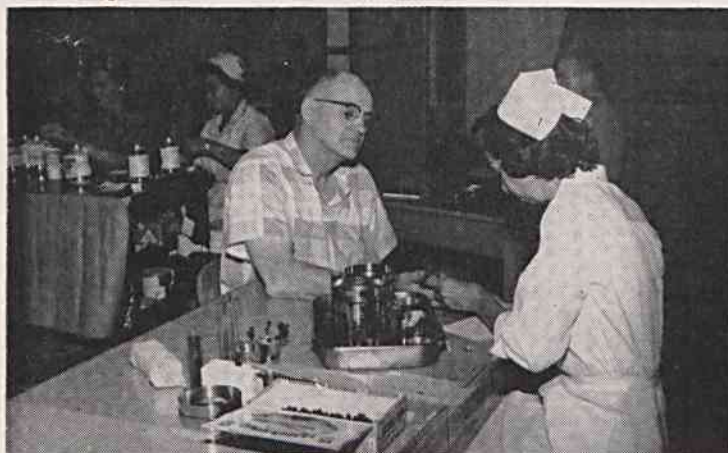

If the high usage continues in May and June, well above 142 pints will be needed when the Bloodmobile visits Leaksville July 30, Mr. Dunton said.
