Scholarship Recipient Makes U.N.C. Honor Roll

Richard Ray Watkins, a Fieldcrest scholarship recipient, made the Honor Roll at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, during the fall semester, 1962-63. He made a grade of "B" or better on all work taken (not less than 15 hours).

In a letter to Richard's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Thomas A. Watkins, the dean of the General College, J. Carlyle Sitterson, pointed out that less than six per cent of the students in the General College achieved such high academic distinction.

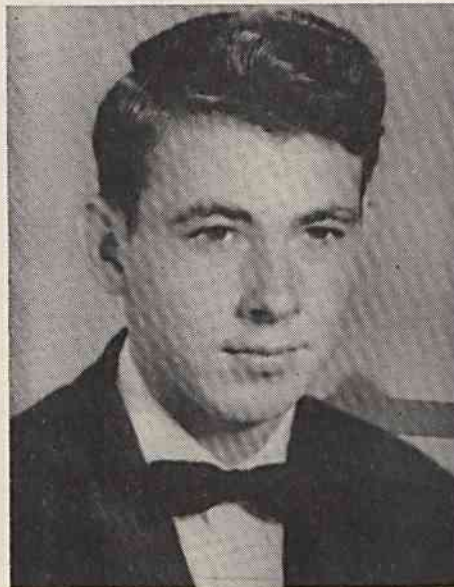
"It is a pleasure to congratulate you on the fine work of your son," Dean Sitterson wrote.

Richard is a 1962 graduate of Morehead High School. His father is a loomfixer at the Bedspread Mill and his mother (Daisy) is a weaver in the same plant.

At the University, where he plans to major in business administration, Richard is being assisted financially by a Fieldcrest scholarship worth \$2,000 over the four years of college attendance.

To date, the Fieldcrest Foundation has granted a total of eight scholarships and is scheduled to give additional scholarships each year to employees or children of employees who are entering college for the first time.

Since March 1, the Fieldcrest Scholarship Committee has been accepting ap-

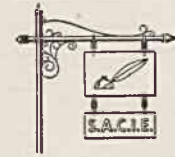
plications for the scholarships to be given this year. April 1 is the deadline for the submission of applications.
