roof also will prevent excessive condensation, helping to preserve the deck and the inside floors.

The old saw-tooth roofs tend "sweat" extensively. The glass windows permit heat to escape in winter and heat from outside to filtrate in summer, making it difficult to maintain uniform conditions inside the mill.

The roof over the Bedsread Department was lowered in 1957. The roofs have been flattened at all other mills where air conditioning has been installed.

Members of our Engineering Department said that all over the South are getting rid of the old saw-tooth roofs and that practically no new mills are being built with the saw-tooth construction.
