Each of the long-service employees was presented the appropriate Fieldcrest service pin and a letter of com-

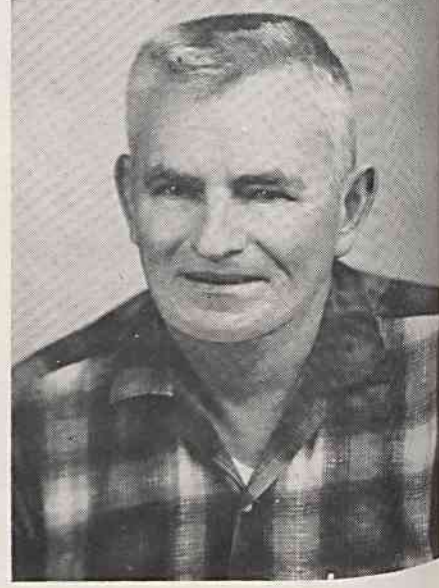

Mr. Frazier is a native of Rockingham County and was first employed May 1, 1919 at the Athena Knitting Mill. He became a weaver at the Bedspread Mill in 1921 and has continued to work at the Bedspread Mill. He was a warp tier 1941-1951 and since 1951 has worked as a tie-in operator.

Miss Roberson was born in Patrick County, Va., and has worked at the Towel Mill continuously since May 6, 1919. She first worked in the Cloth Room and was a trimmer for many years. In 1947 she was transferred to

Mr. Curry was born at Price and began working as a doffer at the Nantucket Mill May 12, 1924.
