Certain Events May Alter Social Security

W. L. O'Brien, district manager of Social Security in Greensboro, reminds people receiving social security benefits that certain events may affect the payment of those benefits. When these events occur, they should be reported to the Social Security Administration.

The death of a beneficiary should be reported promptly, he stated. He also mentioned that the marriage of a beneficiary, unless the beneficiary is receiving benefits as a retired worker, will usually stop payments. Divorce may affect the right to get benefits.

People who are receiving benefits on behalf of a child or an incapable older person, may have those rights altered if there has been a change in custody of the beneficiary.

Any of these events should be reported to the Social Security Administration promptly.
