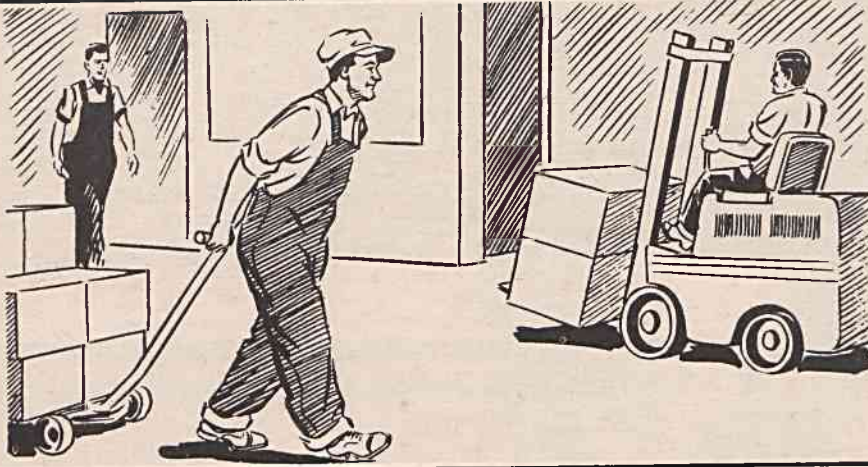


HELP PREVENT PLANT VEHICLE ACCIDENTS



Operators of Electric Trucks

Keep below safe speed limit; watch rear end swing of fork lift trucks.

Sound warning when approaching workers on foot and at blind corners.

Do not overload. Stack materials firmly.

Allow no riders.

Avoid sudden stops. Keep clear of edge of loading decks.

Park only in spaces provided — do not block aisles or passageways.

Hand Truck Operators

Do not overload truck. Stack materials firmly.

Descend ramps with care.

Do not leave an empty or loaded truck to block an aisle or passageway.

Other Plant Personnel

Be alert, using aisles. Listen for warnings, be on lookout for approaching vehicles.

Do not hitch rides on any kind of truck.
