## R. A. Harris Addresses Spray 25-Yr. Club

He said Fieldcrest domestic products have been changed from primarily staple goods in 1939 to our present highlystyled products and that this upgrading of style and quality and innovations in merchandising have made a tremendous impact.

Mr. Harris congratulated the 25-Year Club members and expressed appreciation for their steadfastness and loyalty through the years and their important contributions to the success of the mills.
