


# Store Is Decorated

# Safety Barbecue Won By Bedspr. Finishing

Employees of the Bedspread Finishing Mill are pictured above and on the facing page as they enjoyed a barbeque dinner which they earned under terms of the safety contest at Fieldcrest Mills. The barbeque was served in the mill November 27 on a schedule approximating the employees' usual lunch periods.

The Bedspread Finishing employees were given the barbecue in recognition of having accumulated 279,966 manhours without a lost-time injury, an average of 2,154 accident-free hours per employee since October 14, 1963.

In a letter announcing that the mill had won the barbecue, Frank E. Barron, Jr., manager of the Bedspread Mill and Bedspread Finishing Mill, and Joseph Foster, superintendent of the Bedspread Finishing Mill, commended the enployees on their fine safety record.

"We are sure that each of you enjoys the satisfaction of knowing that your interest and participation in mill safety has helped prevent suffering and lost time injury," the letter said.

"May we urge you to continue you interest in safe work habits and good housekeeping practices so that we can go on to attain the top mill safety position at Fieldcrest. Let's make our goal for the future no lost-time accidents at the Bedspread Finishing Mill."
