But if you're not, you'll still do all right if you can answer 'yes' to the few questions above.

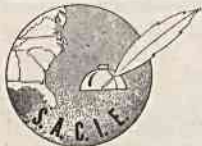
And should you have any of these high gifts, they will shine through with all the greater brilliance if you've given all "yes" answers in this basic little test.
