Student Groups Visit Fieldcrest

Groups of students from Draper Junlor High School and Leaksville-Spray Junior High School toured some of the fieldcrest plants in the Tri-Cities retently as part of a new ninth grade fourse entitled "Introduction to Vocalions."

The Draper students visited the Manket and Sheeting Mills and the Leaksville-Spray group toured the Bed-Spread Mill and the Karastan Rug Mill. At each mill the students assembled and were given information about that Particular mill. They were then divided into smaller groups for the mill tours. Guides were assigned to conduct them

through the mill and to answer their questions.

Approximately 85 students are participating in the course, 70 at Leaksville-Spray Junior High School and 15 at the Draper Junior High School.

Preceding the visits, J. E. Gardner, training manager at Fieldcrest, spoke to the one class at Draper and the four classes at Leaksville-Spray to give advance information that would make the visits more meaningful for the students.
