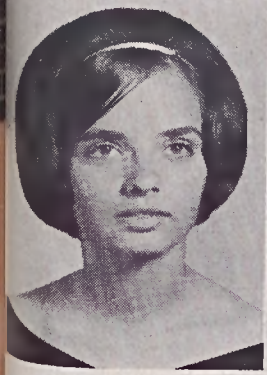

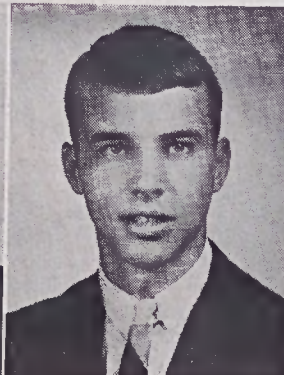

Jan Atkinson's mother, Nadine Atkinson, is employed in the Physical Laboratory of the Research and Quality Control Department. Doris DeLancey's mother is an employee of the Blanket Leave Room. Her mother, Naomi S. DeLancey, is employed in the Sewing Department at the Sheet Finishing Mill. James Finney's father is a weaver at the Blanket Mill and Ned Gardner's mother is Fieldcrest's training manager. Both of Sherry Wood's parents are employed at the Towel Mill, Fieldale, Va. Her father is a wash cloth cutter and her mother, Bertie P. Wood, a wash cloth hemmer in the Towel Mill Sewing Department.

Recipients of Fieldcrest Scholarships are selected on the basis of their academic aptitude, good citizenship and leadership, and the need for financial

assistance in obtaining a college education.

The Fieldcrest Scholarship Committee is composed of Dr. William McGehee, director of personnel research and training, chairman; Dr. L. H. Hance, division vice president for research and engineering; John M. Hough, superintendent of Leaksville Township Schools; and R. H. Tuttle, director of technical services.

Dr. McGehee said the committee found it extremely difficult to choose from the large number of applicants, the majority of whom were exceptionally well qualified. "All of the recipients rank scholastically at or near the top in their class," he said.
